Our Syrian-Armenian angel set to help save the life of a patient





Interview with ABMDR Executive Director

Dr. Sevak Avagyan

Q: The worldwide network of transplant centers and related institutions with which ABMDR has been working is truly impressive. They include City of Hope, the German National Registry of Blood Stem Cell Donors, the National Marrow Donor Program, and others. Now we hear that a major turning point has been reached through the establishment of a transplantation center in Armenia!

A: Yes, this has been our dream from the very beginning, and, after 17 years, it came true! No longer will Armenian patients fighting for their lives have the added stresses of traveling from home—and finding the funds to do so—in order to get a transplant. Today we have a formalized a partnership with the Yeolyan Hematology Center in Yerevan.

Q: So what can you tell us about this new partnership?


A: In December 2016, ABMDR signed a Memorandum of Cooperation (MoC) with the Yeolyan Hematology Center, where the Bone Marrow Transplantation Center is located. This lays the foundation for the center to rely on ABMDR to tissue-type patients and their siblings, free of charge, with the ultimate objective of providing transplant services to the people of Armenia in Armenia.

Q: This is an extraordinary milestone for ABMDR and Armenia alike. How exactly will ABMDR interact with the Bone Marrow Transplantation Center?

A: On an ongoing basis, ABMDR and the center will jointly assess, evaluate, and monitor donor-search and transplantation procedures. ABMDR will advise the center on stem cell harvesting and preservation. More specifically, our HLA Typing Laboratory will perform compatible stem cell donor searches as well as tissue-typing of patients and family members who are likely to be potential donors. We have committed to performing low-resolution tissue typing for up to 60 patients and three family members each, and high-resolution HLA typing for up to 40 patients over the course of this first year, all free of charge.

Q: ABMDR is to be congratulated on this generous spirit of cooperation.

A: The Armenian Bone Marrow Donor Registry has always sought to foster strong partnerships and collaboration, and it is our privilege now to do so more actively and directly for the people of Armenia. This MoC with the Yeolyan Hematology Center brings our work to a whole new level of excellence, in our shared quest to save lives.

ABMDR's first Cancer Awareness Symposium

ABMDR's inaugural Cancer Awareness Symposium was enthusiastically embraced by the Los Angeles Armenian community, as close to 100 attended the informative yet informal event. Featuring a distinguished roster of experts, the symposium took place on September 17, 2016, at the Kouyoumjian Hall of St. Gregory Armenian Catholic Church in Glendale, California.

Opening remarks were delivered by ABMDR President Dr. Frieda Jordan as well as Symposium Chairperson and ABMDR Board member Sona Ashjian.

"Unfortunately cancer remains an often enigmatic illness that can ravage the lives of patients and families," Dr. Jordan said, "but thanks to the medical breakthroughs of the past several decades and ongoing research, we have much reason to be hopeful. On behalf of the entire ABMDR family, I thank our speakers for bringing their wonderful expertise to this important community-benefit event, and I'm confident that when our symposium concludes today, you will leave here with a positive energy, having gained a fresh perspective on health and healing."

"The theme of today's event is 'Knowledge is power,'" said Symposium Chairperson Sona Ashjian in her welcome remarks. "That's because our goal is to help raise awareness of cancer among our community, through a series of presentations delivered by highly knowledgeable and experienced medical professionals in the fields of commonly occurring cancers."

The featured speakers, introduced by ABMDR Board member Dr. Christina Ashjian, included Dr. Boris Bagdasarian, a specialist in hematology, oncology, and internal medicine and chairman of Glendale Adventist Medical Center's Cancer Committee; Dr. Nubar Boghossian, also a specialist in hematology, oncology, and internal medicine; Dr. Vergine Madelian, ABMDR Outreach and Education Officer and a professor of Biology at California State University, Northridge; Susanna Tamazyan, a registered nurse at Glendale Adventist Medical Center; Dr. Ani Balmanoukian, another specialist in hematology, oncology, and internal medicine; Ella Boghossian, a breast-cancer survivor; Dr. Armen Kassabian, a urologist; Dr. Robert Gellibolian, a biochemist and integrative-health consultant; Cynthia Klinger, a marriage and family therapist; Areg Boyamyan, Senior Vice President at Foundation Laboratory and Senior Vice President of reveal23, a genetic-testing company in Los Angeles; and Dr. Peter Ashjian, a plastic surgeon.

Also delivering remarks was California State Senator Anthony Portantino. The symposium focused on a number of common cancers, including colon, breast, and prostate cancer as well as leukemia and lymphoma. Speakers discussed cancer prevention, including nutrition and lifestyle changes; detection and diagnosis; and the very latest treatment options, including alternative treatments. The symposium also comprised presentations on stem cell transplantation, support groups, and genetic testing, as well as survivor stories. The event included two question-and-answer sessions with the panelists, moderated by ABMDR Board member Dr. Evelyn Baghdasraian. The Cancer Awareness Symposium was made possible by the support of major sponsors Glendale Adventist Medical Center, Los Angeles Cancer Network, reveal23 (Foundation Laboratory), and the Armenian-American Medical Society.

Further enhancements to our lab expertise

Armine Hyusyan receives advanced trainings in Germany

In 2016, Armine Hyusyan, the supervisor of the ABMDR HLA Typing Laboratory in Yerevan, was granted an EFI bursary, which allowed her to receive advanced trainings at the Transplant Immunology Department of the Institute of Transfusion Medicine and Immunogenetics (ITMI) in Ulm, Germany. The scope of Armine's trainings included advanced HLA typing methodologies and other aspects of histocompatibility and immunogenetics, as well as advanced trainings in bone marrow donor-search processes.

"The Department of Transplant Immunology of ITMI is one of the biggest facilities of its kind in Europe," Armine says. "I was very pleased and honored to learn that the Department of Transplant Immunology had agreed to host me as a trainee for two weeks. Our German colleagues have always been willing to provide us with training and expert consultations on any professional matter."

Through her trainings in Ulm, Armine was able to complete certain core modules of the European Specialization in Histocompatibility and Immunogenetics Diploma syllabus. Her examination for the Diploma is slated for May 2017. As importantly, her newly acquired skills and insights will be invaluable for her work as lab supervisor, in view of the 2016 launch of Armenia's first-ever Transplantation Center, and the fact that ABMDR expects to be even more involved in related/unrelated searches of local and international donor databases, conducted for patients living in Armenia.

"I would like to express my profound gratitude to the EFI Education Committee for sponsoring my training at the Transplant Immunology Department in Ulm," Armine says. "And I would like to extend my sincerest thanks and appreciation to all the professors and the HLA Laboratory team for their wonderful knowledge, guidance, and support."

Alina Sirunyan to receive WMDA International Search Coordinator Certificate

In October 2016, Alina Sirunyan, ABMDR's senior lab technician and database manager, began a nine-month course of study, at the conclusion of which she will be certified as an International Search Coordinator.

The course, provided by the World Marrow Donor Association, is intended to equip participants with advanced skills and knowledge with regard to bone marrow donor-search and selection processes and strategies. As Alina explains, "The course consists of nine e-learning lectures on scientific and practical topics pertaining to the work of donor-search coordinators, delivered by renowned speakers in the fields of histocompatibility, immunogenetics, and hematopoietic stem cell transplantation."

Cord blood banking: for my child's future health

I was a teenager when the Armenian Bone Marrow Donor Registry (ABMDR) was established in Armenia. My parents often spoke about this pan-national organization, expressing their deep admiration and support. As soon as I reached adulthood, I joined the ranks of ABMDR as a potential bone marrow stem cell donor. Today, I am so very happy that the Registry has facilitated close to 30 bone marrow transplants, and hope that one day I myself will be identified as a match, thereby being able to help save someone's life.

I have always followed the successes of ABMDR with great interest. Among its major milestones are its Stem Cell Harvesting Center and outstanding work in stem cell and cord blood banking. On June 9, 2016, with the birth of my first child, Ruben, I didn't think twice to



request that ABMDR collect my son's umbilical cord blood and preserve it in perpetuity, in case someday it would be needed for a life-saving procedure.

Stem cell research and the utilization of stem cells have revolutionized medicine and continue to grow by leaps and bounds, ushering in a world of wonderful new possibilities. Therefore, by preserving our newborns' life-giving stem cells today, we help secure their future health.

ABMDR remembers two fallen Artsakh officers who had joined our ranks as bone marrow donors

Two Artsakh Defense Army officers who were killed during the Azeri invasion of Artsakh in early April 2016 were bone marrow donors registered with ABMDR. The fallen officers, Hovsep Kirakosyan, 28, and Ashot Shahbazyan, 23, had joined the ranks of ABMDR as potential bone marrow donors in 2006 and 2010, respectively, during large-scale donor recruitments held at Yerevan's Vazgen Sargsyan Military Institute.

After receiving the sad news of the deaths of officers Kirakosyan and Shahbazyan, Dr. Frieda Jordan and Dr. Sevak Avagyan paid visits to the officers' families in Artsakh. The ABMDR representatives conveyed their condolences to the families and made small donations, as tokens of ABMDR's profound appreciation of the bravery and selflessness of the young men who had made the ultimate sacrifice for their homeland.

ABMDR's mission showcased at launch of Armenia-Israel International Public Forum

On April 4, 2016, the establishment of the Armenia-Israel International Public Forum was officially announced during a joint meeting in Yerevan between a delegation representing Israel, the Ambassador of Israel in Armenia, leaders of Armenia's Jewish community, and Armenian leaders representing a broad range of sectors. The Forum was created as a platform for multifaceted

collaboration between Israel and Armenia. The event's invitees included ABMDR Executive Director Dr. Sevak Avagyan and Medical Director Dr. Mihran Nazaretyan, both of whom participated in the discussions and exchanges of opinions. As one of the forum's speakers, Dr. Nazaretyan made a comprehensive presentation about the ABMDR mission, focusing on donor recruit-

ment, international donor searches, and identification of matched unrelated bone marrow donors for patients in various countries requiring transplantation. As an illustration of the work of ABMDR, Dr. Nazaretyan cited the March 2016 bone marrow transplantation of a cancer patient in Tel Aviv, a procedure that was made possible by stem cells donated by a matched donor in Armenia.

Our Syrian-Armenian heroine

The Armenian nation has a long history in Syria. A hundred years ago, we saw the flow of Armenians to Syria; and now we see the flow of Armenians from Syria to Armenia. Yet amidst these movements, caused by persecutions, wars, and suffering, there flows something wonderful and hopeful and life-affirming. It is flowing in the blood of Mrs. Mayda Yakoubian. Mayda signed up as a prospective donor when ABMDR was recruiting in Aleppo in 2006. Since that time, she has witnessed the growing crisis in her country while, unknown to her, a patient in Germany was experiencing his own personal crisis: a life-threatening blood cancer. But there was hope, as the patient's search request yielded Mayda's name. Would we be able to find her? Yes! And what an angel.

Mayda responded immediately to our contact, absolutely eager to help. Subsequently ABMDR worked with the Republic of Armenia's Ministry of Defense and Ministry of the Diaspora, as well as the President's office, to obtain confirmatory blood samples via a humanitarian charter flight from Yerevan to Latakia, Syria. There, Tigran Gevorgyan, Armenia's Consul General in Aleppo, forwarded necessary supplies to ABMDR Syrianbased volunteer Dr. Vicken Aroyan, who obtained Mayda's blood sample and sent it back to Yerevan via diplomatic mail. The blood sample is now at a transplant center in Berlin, ready for processing. ABMDR is waiting for a decision from the patient's medical team. We are profoundly grateful for the life-giving forces within Mayda, and those embodied by all the people who help facilitate our work. Angels all.

ABMDR vastly expands IT infrastructure by adopting Prometheus platform

In early 2017, ABMDR's HLA Typing Lab in Yerevan significantly expanded its IT infrastructure by adopting the Prometheus platform, which provides up-to-the-minute access to global registry databases and streamlines donor-match searches.

A cloud-based software, the Prometheus system ensures a cost-effective, reliable IT connection with Bone Marrow Donors Worldwide (BMDW) and larger registries such as the National Marrow Donor Program (NMDP). By enabling unprecedented donor visibility, patient access to donors, and communication with other registries, the system vastly enhances the process of finding bone marrow matches.

The ABMDR Lab staff has received comprehensive training in the utilization of the Prometheus system, in early 2017. The training was provided by Albert Mustafin of Prometheus. We thank OGMA, Inc. and its president and CEO, Harmik Baghdasarian, for implementing our data conversion and its transfer to the Prometheus system. At the conclusion of the training, Armine Hyusyan, our lab supervisor, and Alina Sirunyan, our senior lab technician and database manager, received Prometheus certification.







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Recruitment for ABMDR patient Yervant Portakal with Organization of Istanbul Armenians




