But equally important to these quantitative measures are the qualitative aspects of our work. I am very pleased to relay that the cooperative agreement we made with Armenia's health leadership has resulted in a robust

collaboration between ABMDR and the Armenian Bone Marrow Transplantation Center, with 14 patients and their 24 siblings tissue-typed as of this writing. Interview with ABMDR Executive Director

Dr. Sevak Avagyan

Q: The Internet has made it easier and faster for people to connect — from professional and personal networking to shopping online. How is ABMDR taking advantage of the latest technology in this regard?

A: In November 2017, we acquired membership in the EMDIS (European Marrow Donor Information System) software program, which allows access to 40 interna-

tional registries with one click of a button. In less than two months, we have connected with 15 registries, and are getting three times more daily search requests compared to the established email and fax communications.

Q: That is an exponential increase in a very short period of time! What are you projecting the impact will be in the months ahead?

A: Right now the ABMDR is getting unprecedented international visibility. In the months ahead, we expect to expand our donor population by recruiting a new generation of young, dedicated individuals with a high

Q: What other ways are you seeking to recruit more prospective donors?

A: We now have nearly 30,000 donors in the Registry, and every additional registrant increases our statistical odds of finding matches for our patients. We are thrilled with the potential of the EMDIS to expand our visibility, but we must always be aggressive in organizing recruitment drives for targeted populations of our world community. For 2018, we are specifically planning major recruitments in Armenia and Artsakh.

Q: You mentioned "targeted populations." What does that mean?

A: Although we encourage registrants between the ages of 18 and 50 to sign up as potential bone marrow/stem cell donors, scientifically speaking, our most viable prospective stem cell donors are in the younger demographic segment, between the ages of 18 and 29 or so. Therefore we attach strategic importance to maintaining ongoing contact with the ministries of education in both Armenia and in Artsakh, as they are our traditional partners in organizing recruitment drives at universities and other higher-education venues. In addition, military schools — and cadets in particular are also within the permanent scope of our interest.

ABMDR: your friends for life

Stem cell transplantation remains an effective and sometimes the only treatment option for many patients suffering from any of a wide range of malignant (leukemias and lymphomas) and sometimes nonmalignant conditions.


Recent advances in technology, science, supportive care, HLA-typing (human leukocyte antigen), and treatment/management have led to improved outcomes for patients undergoing transplantation. Hematopoietic stem cells are immature precursor

cells residing within the bone marrow spaces that are capable of giving rise to most of the cellular elements within the blood, including lymphoid, erythroid, and myeloid lines.

Hematopoietic stem cells can be obtained from peripheral blood, bone marrow, or umbilicus cord blood. Allogeneic stem cell transplantation has progressed enormously over the past decade. Extensive planning and coordination of care is required for all transplantation candidates, usually involving a network of physicians, nurses, and coordinators as well as supportive staff.



Choosing the right donor for a successful transplant is a complex science. It involves the highly specialized HLA antigen testing in order to search for an HLA matched donor, beginning with siblings, matched related donors, syngeneic donors (twins), haploidentical (parents) donors, or matched unrelated donors. Careful donor selection and evaluation are integral parts of the pre-transplantation process. That is where the Armenian Bone Marrow Donor Registry comes in, in light of the very promising and encouraging results that have shown a great impact on our society in terms of treating hematological malignancies.


















ABMDR: your trusted guide on an unpredictable journey

Each of us hopes that we will never get that call from the doctor who says, "You have blood cancer," or "Your child has blood cancer." But we know all too well that it can happen, and when that news comes, our hearts sink, our minds race, and we can feel paralyzed with fear and anxiety.

As a doctor, I have seen patients and their families experience these emotions when they receive news of a life-threatening disease. Those of us in our profession do our best to allay fears, and to give families a medical "road map" to understand



the journey ahead of them. But when it comes to blood cancer — with the many unknowns of whether various treatments will work, or won't - you also need a personal guide to help prepare you with all the resources you need for this journey of twists and turns.

That guide for ethnic Armenians is the Armenian Bone Marrow Donor Registry. I encourage anyone who hears the frightening news from their doctor to immediately contact ABMDR to help them prepare for the journey ahead. And I encourage you to heed the first piece of advice they will give you: have tissue typing done for the members of your family.

There are many forms of blood cancer, and some are more aggressive than others. A stem cell transplant may be an immediate course of action, or it may be necessary only months after other treatments have failed. But no one — not even the doctors — can predict with certainty what lies ahead. If and when that transplant is needed, those families that do the tissue typing at the beginning of the journey and identify a match don't lose any precious time to be ready for that potentially

How fortunate we are to have ABMDR at our sides when crisis strikes. And for those of us who have not gotten that frightening call from the doctor, I urge you still to plan ahead for that possibility: join the Registry if you haven't already.

We all need to feel empowered as we journey through this life — whatever it throws our way.

My first introduction to ABMDR was back in 2005, meeting our beloved little Biurad during his stay at Children's Hospital Los Angeles. I was so moved by his kind soul; his warm, attentive family; and the strength behind his gentle spirit. I will never forget him, and still think about those days when, like many of you, I juggled my days between motherhood and my life's calling in medicine.

It was then that I committed myself to ABMDR's life-saving mission, to find a donor for children in need of bone marrow transplantation, knowing that as Armenians we hold the key to saving each other more than anyone else possibly could.

As a physician, I know this to be a truth. Our teaching indicates that our genetic match is closest to our own, our HLA type more likely to be found among Armenians, yet we can also help cultures close to us in proximity. I know the importance of



creating this registry, supporting our Stem Cell Harvesting Center in Yerevan, and ensuring the survivability of this important database for our people.

As a mother, I know that there is nothing in the world I would not do for my children. I know that I would give my life to save a hair on their heads. That same love lives in all of us, and together we can save children all over the world from these devastating diseases with the simple donation of bone marrow — one small gesture to help make a world of difference for a family on the edge of devastation, to save their most precious little child. Please be a donor, and give a parent, family, and child the most simple gift: the gift of life.

Artsakh army officer helps save the life of a cancer patient in Iran

ABMDR salutes young officer and celebrates 30th life saved through a transplant

n July 3, 2017, ABMDR facilitated its 30th bone marrow stem cell transplant, thanks to stem cells harvested from a young ABMDR matched donor. The stem cells of the donor, Sergey, who is a 24-yearold army officer serving on the frontline in Artsakh, were utilized to save the life of a cancer patient in Iran.

In 2012, Sergey had joined the ranks of ABMDR during a recruitment drive at the Vazgen Sargsyan Military Institute, in Yerevan. Five years later, he was found to be a perfect match for a patient in Iran who was suffering from leukemia and whose only hope for survival was to receive a bone marrow stem cell transplant from a compatible donor. Subsequently Sergey was given a day off to leave the frontline to come to ABMDR's Stem Cell Harvesting Center in Yerevan to donate his stem cells and save a patient's life.

Accompanied by his young wife and six-month-old son, Sergey was greeted by ABMDR staff. The painless, noninvasive harvesting procedure, performed by Dr. Andranik Mshetsyan, lasted about four hours. Also present at the procedure were ABMDR Executive Director Dr. Sevak Avagyan and Medical Director Dr. Mihran Nazaretyan. At the conclusion of the harvesting, as staff members performed quality-control analyses of the harvested cells and packed them for the special courier who was waiting to transport the precious gift of life to the patient in Iran, Sergey — a hero in the eyes of all, on the frontline as well as far away from them - joined his young family, while someone in Iran was about to get a second chance for life.

ABMDR Lab staff completes Prometheus training, enhances IT infrastructure


In 2017, the Armenian Bone Marrow Donor Registry's HLA Typing Lab in Yerevan significantly expanded its IT infrastructure by adopting the Prometheus platform, which provides up-to-the-minute access to global registry databases and streamlines donor-match searches. A core aspect of our adoption of the Prometheus platform

was our lab staff's extensive training in the utilization of the system, provided by Albert Mustafin. The training of Armine Hyusyan, our lab supervisor, and Alina Sirunyan, our senior lab technician and database manager, concluded in mid-2017. Armine and Alina have also received Prometheus certification. We thank OGMA, Inc. and its president and CEO, Harmik Baghdasarian, for implementing our data conversion and its transfer to the Prometheus system. By enabling unprecedented donor visibility, patient access to donors, and communication with other registries across the world, the Prometheus system vastly enhances the process of finding bone marrow matches from a global pool of donors.

On December 6, 2017, we held a donor-recruitment drive at St. Gregory Armenian Church in Glendale, California, in support of an Armenian patient in Los Angeles, Constantin Malek Andrasians, as well as other patients across the world. Malek Andrasians, 65, is suffering from a lifethreatening blood-related illness. His only chance of survival is to have a bone marrow stem-cell transplant, which would be possible only if he

is matched with a stem-cell donor. The recruitment drive was organized jointly with members of Malek Andrasians' family. The family was also instrumental in raising public awareness of their loved one's plight. With ABMDR volunteers on hand to answer questions, give out vital information, and administer a simple swab test, a total of 72 supporters joined the ranks of ABMDR as potential bone marrow donors.

On June 5, 2017, the Armenian Bone Marrow Donor Registry held a major recruitment at the Yerevan headquarters of PicsArt Armenia. The



event, which was organized within the framework of the #PicsArtCitizen program, drew the enthusiastic support of PicsArt's Yerevan team, with 72 young men and women joining the ranks of ABMDR

as potential bone marrow stem cell donors. A team from ABMDR's Yerevan Lab, led by Dr. Mihran Nazaretyan, the Registry's medical director, was on hand to answer questions and collect a very small blood sample from each volunteer, as part of the recruitment process. PicsArt is behind the global phenomenon of the PicsArt App, which lets users edit photos and videos, and create drawings, paintings, and collages on their smartphones. #PicsArtCitizen is the company's initiative to encourage its employees to be engaged in civic activism and become involved in worthy causes.















World Marrow Donor Day, Vazgen Sargsyan Military Institute

On September 25, 2017, ABMDR celebrated World Marrow Donor Day by holding a recruitment drive at the Vazgen Sargsyan Military Institute, in Yerevan. Prior to the recruitment, ABMDR Medical Director Dr. Mihran Nazaretyan made a presentation on the life-saving mission of the Registry, speaking in the auditorium of the Vazgen Sargsyan Military Institute. During the subsequent recruitment, administered by a team from ABMDR's Yerevan Lab, a total of 60 soldiers and Vazgen Sargsyan Military Institute staff members registered as potential bone marrow donors. The Vazgen Sargsyan Military Institute is a longtime supporter of the ABMDR cause. ABMDR also held a recruitment in Tehran in honor of World Marrow Donor Day (see page 19).

Recruitment and outreach



On June 2, 2017, a delegation of ABMDR Board members made a series of presentations and held a donor recruitment at the Armenian Community Center of Buenos Aires, organized by the Armenian Relief Society (ARS) of Argentina. The ABMDR delegation included Dr. Frieda Jordan, President; Dr. Sevak Avagyan, Executive Director; Dr. Vergine Madelian, Outreach and Education Officer; Fimi Mekhitarian, West Coast Recruitment Officer; and Dr. Nani Oskanian. The delegation was in Argentina to participate in the 12th Armenian Medical World Congress, which took place from May 31 through June 2 in Buenos Aires.

During the outreach and recruitment drive at the Armenian Community Center, Doctors Jordan and Avagyan delivered talks about the genesis of ABMDR and its work worldwide, while Dr. Madelian made a comprehensive presentation on donor recruitment and stem cell transplantation. Moreover, the ABMDR Board members discussed future prospects for further collaboration and recruitment opportunities in South America, particularly in Brazil and Uruguay, both of which have sizeable Armenian communities.





World Marrow Donor Day recruitment

On September 16, 2017, during the annual Pan-Armenian (Hamahaykakan) Games that took place at the Ararat Sports Complex in Tehran, 66 supporters joined the ranks of ABMDR as potential bone marrow stem cell donors. Walk of Life New England







ABMDR New England held its sixth annual Walk of Life on September 23, 2017, garnering enthusiastic community support. 


